WHY WE DO WHAT WE DO

We have all seen the devastating damage that has resulted due to the COVID-19 pandemic, especially in the West African region. Not only has it caused fatalities and disabilities, but also had a significant socioeconomic impact on all population groups. 3 NATIONAL ETHICS COMMITTEES ISO-9001 CERTIFIED

The National ethics committees of Benin, Mali, and Senegal would, by the end of 2022, be certified in quality management according to the highest international standard accreditation. This is expected to improve the services they provide to researchers and reduce processing times for research protocol clearance, which would accelerate the production of safe and effective medicinal products and interventions.



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2 INTERNATIONAL CONGRESSES

In 2022 and 2023, respectively, two international congresses will be held where scientists from all over the ECOWAS and Spain will be invited to showcase their perspectives, thoughts, and research results concerning the topics of research ethics during the COVID-19 pandemic, gender in research ethics, and the governance of national ethics committees during health emergencies.

100+ SCIENTISTS TRAINED

In the context of the project's multiple training programs, over 100 junior and senior scientists and ethicists from all of the 15 ECOWAS countries will be trained and followed up, some of which will have the opportunity to conduct hands-on training at the Aragon research ethics committee (CEICA) in Zaragoza, Spain.
